Podium Shows after each race allowing fans to hear the leading riders' reactions minutes after the Prosecco DOC is sprayed, live on-stage commentary, competitions, Meet 'n' Greets; the Paddock Show arena provides an unforgettable atmosphere and experience for all who visit it.


On top of this, and introduced in 2018, is the opportunity for fans to be involved with the post-race celebrations, as WorldSBK continues to welcome **Parc Ferme into the Fan Zone**.

Pure passion can be felt right through the packed crowds at the WorldSBK Paddock Show, as anticipation for the weekend ahead builds from Friday morning. As well as bringing riders and fans together, the WorldSBK Paddock Show is a vital promotional tool which gives companies and Sponsors the chance to hold Product Presentations, Press Conferences and Workshops; for either their own staff or in a public form. It is not only entertainment on stage that keeps the fans enthralled throughout the weekend. Stunning displays featuring all WorldSBK manufacturers competing on track allows fans to see the amazing machines up close.

Continuing to grow year on year, 2019 will see the Paddock Show get bigger and better, with more opportunities for fans to meet the stars of all three championship classes. The continuation and expansion of the SuperShow on Saturdays into a 90-minute extravaganza will ensure that at each event every single rider will be involved on stage. From Parc Ferme, podiums, evening concerts and media events to autograph sessions, video promotions, sponsor displays, competitions and a plethora of other entertainment, the Paddock Show is bound to bring in big crowds and will play an even bigger part in the story of WorldSBK 2019 and beyond.









Born in 1988, the Superbike World Championship began with the ethos of bringing production-based motorbikes to the track.

Appealing to the ordinary bike fan, the series' popularity grew rapidly as it attracted big personalities who allowed the sport to grow and be shaped into what it is today; one of the world's most prestigious bike racing series.

Starting with Fred Merkel taking back-to-back championships aboard the Honda RC30, the series continued to progress into the 'glory years' - birthing stars still around today. With over 17 different World Champions crowned since the series' inaugural season 32 years ago, the ever-changing grid and thrill of racing have kept fans and riders captivated ever since. The early 1990's saw the American Dream live on - despite

a French Revolution - as Raymond Roche gave Ducati their first WorldSBK crown. Doug Polen and Scott Russell took the honors respectively for Ducati and Kawasaki ahead of the 'Fogarty Era'. That saw the popularity of World Superbike skyrocket and allowed it to establish a firm fan base who still flock to circuits today, as close and edge-of-your-seat racing became the basis for this ever-popular series.

'King' Carl Fogarty made his mark on the series from 1994 with Ducati's 916. The Brit secured four world titles, as well as facing stiff competition from the likes of teammate Troy Corser and Honda's Colin Edwards and Aaron Slight.

The Trio, along with Suzuki's Pierfrancesco Chili, Kawasaki's Akira Yanagawa and Yamaha's 'Nitro' Noriyuki Haga were able to battle into the new millennium in what was one of the most exciting championships. Following this growth in popularity, WorldSBK now welcomes more than half a million trackside spectators every year.

Then came the years of Troy Bayliss and Colin Edwards

battling with the likes of Ruben Xaus, Neil Hodgson and Regis Laconi. As Pirelli came in as single tyre manufacturer, James Toseland became the youngest World Superbike champion in 2004 with Ducati, holding off Frenchman Regis Laconi before Australian pair Troy Corser and Troy Bayliss continued to reign in 2005 and 2006. Housing some of the greatest on-track battles seen in motorbike racing, the international paddock became even more renowned in the world of motorsport.

Although an active manufacturer in the series since it began, Yamaha took their first title in 2009 with American rookie Ben Spies after a hotly-fought season long battle with WorldSBK veteran, Noriyuki Haga. Battles between Max Biaggi and the experienced Carlos Checa emerged in the following seasons, before we entered the 'Kawasaki era', seeing both take world titles.

Dorna Sports took over of the rights to the series in 2013 and WorldSBK has continued to go from strength to strength. With four different classes coming to blows every weekend, the series provides some of the closest racing action in the world, with seven manufacturers now taking to the grid to put on one of the greatest shows on earth.

From 2013, British rider Tom Sykes led a resurgence for the green machine that is the Kawasaki. The Japanese factory have dominated the series for the last five seasons, despite tough competition from Sylvain Guintoli and Aprilia in 2014. It's been the Kawasaki lineup of Sykes and Jonathan Rea who have been taking control of the MOTUL FIM Superbike World Championship we have today.

Becoming the first rider to take back to back titles since Fogarty, Rea secured his fourth title in dominant style with two rounds of the 2018 season remaining. Making history once again, Rea looks unstoppable as he begins



the journey for his fifth title but for 2019, he will face stiff competition not only from his new team-mate Leon Haslam, coming back to WorldSBK after four years, but also from the new Ducati's pair Chaz Davies and Alvaro Bautista.

Coming from the MotoGP™ paddock, the Spanish star joins the official Ducati team this season to debut the new Panigale V4, the first four-cylinder machine from the Bologna manufacturer to drop into WorldSBK with the aim to break Kawasaki's four-year stranglehold on the World Superbike championship.

There are still many question marks hanging over the V4, but there is full trust from the Italian marque in their new project. Will the Ducati's riders be able to stop Kawasaki's dominance with their new Panigale V4 R beasts?

SUPERSPORT (FIM WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP

Unmissable action is provided for fans once again as World Supersport continues to be the main support class for WorldSBK, but the Championship provides its own world

class racing worthy of its own accolade. With a permanent entry list of 23 riders, all capable of putting up a strong fight, the grid is one which will stir up all levels of drama.

Welcomed into the paddock as a European class, it became a World Series in 1997 with Paolo Casoli taking this first crown for Ducati in 1997, before it was taken under the FIM's umbrella in 1999 to become the FIM Supersport World Championship. Fans were treated to an array of different manufacturers battling for the title in the early years, and Stephane Chambon was the first title-holder for Suzuki in 1999. The Frenchman was unable to hold on at the turn of the millennium however, as Jorg Teuchert was able to take those honours - before Andrew Pitt took Kawasaki to the top in 2001. Astonishingly, the series then saw a fourth manufacturer stand on top over all, with Frenchman Fabien Foret riding the Honda to glory in 2002 with Ten Kate.

Australian domination entered the field in 2003, with Chris Vermeulen victorious in 2003 before Karl Muggeridge mirrored his heroics a season later. Records were then made in 2006 as Sebastien Charpentier became the first rider to take back to back WorldSSP titles. However, it wasn't long before

Turkish rider Kenan Sofuoglu came onto the scene, taking the 2007 crown. 2008 saw Andrew Pitt make his return to the top with Ten Kate Honda, and in 2009 World Supersport became one of the most fiercely competitive series as four manufactures were capable of fighting for podium finishes. A season-long battle between Cal Crutchlow and Eugene Laverty emerged, with Crutchlow crowned champion on his Yamaha YZF R6, ahead of Laverty on his Parkalgar Honda.

In 2010 it was a new decade but experienced champions, as Sofuoglu took his second title with Ten Kate Honda; despite tense competition from Joan Lascorz with Kawasaki and Eugene Laverty on the Parkalgar Honda, Sofuloglu clinched the crown by only a handful points in the final round. British riders continued to filter through the ranks, and 2011 saw Chaz Davies bounce back from a tough season opener to take the title in a highly competitive year.

2012 welcomed the true beginning of the Sofuoglu era, as the former champion returned to the series with Lorenzini Kawasaki and in turn became the most successful rider ever in the class. 2013 saw Sofuoglu face a tough season

trying to defend his title, and with main rival Sam Lowes putting up a solid fight, the Brit eventually came out on top ahead of the Turkish rider - making the 2013 season one of the most unforgettable in the classes' history. Frenchman Jules Cluzel made his comeback in 2014 -Sofulogu's main rival two seasons previous – whilst Sam Lowes moved over to Moto2. By then a veteran in the series, Sofuoglu had a tough year and with changes to his team mid-way through the season was only able to come out in eighth position overall- and a new young talent emerged in Dutchman Michael van der Mark. In his second year with the PATA Honda World Supersport Team, van der Mark took the title after securing six wins. Cluzel was again close to clinching the title in 2015, but the Frenchman suffered a huge crash in Jerez which put him out of contention despite having taken three victories in the season. This left the door wide open for Kenan Sofuoglu, who took his fourth title. The Turkish rider's legend was finally cemented in the series in 2016, as he took his fifth title with Kawasaki Puccetti Racing following a season-long fight with teammate Randy Krummenacher and a recovering Cluzel. However 2017 welcomed even more drama, with Sofuoglu sidelined following a massive crash around the French circuit

of Magny-Cours, and Frenchman Lucas Mahias was able to take advantage of his championship lead on board the Yamaha YZF R6, and was crowned World Champion in the final round of the season at Qatar. In 2018 and after having won five world championship title in his career, "King" Kenan Sofuoglu unexpectedly decided to retire after sustaining another big crash in the opening round of the season while he was still recovering from the old injuries. Sofuoglu's swansong took place at Imola round and during that weekend the whole paddock gave a warm send off to the most successful rider in the WorldSSP history.

With the main rival out of the game, Lucas Mahias hoped to have an easier life to protect his crown, but soon he understood that it was not going as he had planned.

Coming to the WordSSP paddock at the very last minute before the start of the season, 2012 Moto3™ World Champion Sandro Cortese brought on a tough fight with the Frenchman and his compatriot Jules Cluzel, bringing the championship fight down to the wire until the very last round of the season in Qatar. Thanks to his consistency Cortese was able to get the crown, while his main championship contender Cluzel crashed out in the early stages of the final race leaving the door open to the German to its first WorldSSP title.

SUPERSPORT (

Heading into its fourth season in the WorldSBK series, the FIM Europe Supersport Cup joins the World Supersport Championship throughout all European rounds of the season. With seven entries once again for 2018, the Cup was created to allow riders to compete on the world stage, whilst keeping costs low for both the riders and the teams. By only travelling around Europe, logistics and bike preparation costs are kept as low as possible - but with global coverage thanks to the mass-media and TV channels. Following the same technical regulations as WorldSSP, riders line up on the WorldSSP grid from round three at MotorLand Aragon. In it's debut season, fans saw the fight for the Cup come down to the wire, but it was Italian Axel Bassani's to lose as he took the inaugural Cup win in the final round at Jerez, ahead of Ukranian Illia Mykhalchyk and fellow Italian Alessandro Zaccone. Fighting across nine rounds of 2016, there was some close racing involved as the riders raced not only themselves but the entire WorldSSP field. It was a close battle at the beginning of the season between the two Italians, before Zaccone suffered some bad luck and Mykhalchyk was able to sneak into second position. 2017 welcomed domination from Estonian youngster Hannes Soomer, who took the Cup title in the final round of Jerez, after leading the standings throughout the full season. Despite some tough competition from Dutch rider Rob Hartog in the closing rounds, ultimately it was Soomer who was able to take his advantage into Spain and come out on top.

After Rob Hartog finally clinched the title in 2018, who will take over as the next Europe Supersport Cup Champion in 2019? In a separate fight to WorldSSP, riders and teams receive their own rewards and press coverage for the winners - whilst still scoring World Championship points and starting on the WorldSSP grid. The initiative was introduced in 2016 and continues to prove successful and popular, and the new season holds a lot of potential for new talent and stunning racing.

SUPERSPORT300

World Supersport 300 is heading into its third full time season as a new feeder class. With a minimum rider age of 15, it features a range of lightweight sport bikes, and is an easily accessible championship on the world stage. With a jam-packed grid, the debut season proved popular with fans and riders alike, welcoming three different manufacturers and six Different race winners to the field.

Tight, close and fair racing was enjoyed by all, and even welcomed the first ever female winner of a world championship race. Marc Garcia took the title to the wire, taking the victory by just one point overall on his Yamaha machine, following a stunning season of victories.

In 2018 history has been made as Ana Carrasco became the second ever WorldSSP300 Champion and the first ever female rider to achieve such a result on the international road racing scene.

For 2019 changes are on the horizon as the class will have 51 riders ready to contend the championship crown. Seeing the feeder class grow year on year, the new changes will welcome even more opportunities for riders to shine up for, as they make their debuts in the WorldSBK paddock. With the WorldSSP300 entry list increasing for 2019, participants will be separated into two groups of riders for both Free Practice and Tissot Superpole and at the end of them the top 30 on the combined timesheets will make up Sunday's grid. For all riders who qualify outside of the top 30, they will be granted one final opportunity to line up on the grid as Saturday afternoon will welcome a 'last chance' race, and the top six over the line will compete in Sunday's main race. These changes will be offering an even greater opportunity to young riders and there will be even more chance to gain experience out on track. On top of that, 2019 will see WorldSSP300 fly out to Qatar to compete around the Losail International Circuit in the final round of the season.





Pirelli, upon completion of intense and constant development work which started in 2017 and continued throughout 2018, is pleased to introduce the **new 2019 DIABLO™ range of tyres in compounds intended for track use**.

The goal that guided this development, which has resulted in the new solutions, was to increase consistent performance and, especially for the rear, 'mechanical resistance'.

Pirelli's offer of DIABLO™ tyres in various compounds has historically included DIABLO™ Superbike slicks and grooved DIABLO™ Supercorsa SC, joined by specialist products for the wet such as the DIABLO™ Rain and Wet tyres.

In line with the philosophy that has always distinguished Pirelli's approach to two-wheeled racing, throughout the year these new solutions will also be made available for purchase to all professional and 'grass-roots' riders and even track-day enthusiasts.

The new 2019 range includes:

- new compounds for the DIABLO™ Superbike slicks in the standard 200/60 ZR 17 rear and 120/70 ZR 17 front sizes;
- new SCX solution (EXTRASOFT) in 200/65 size for the DIABLO™ Superbike slick
- new, larger size DIABLO™ Superbike slicks only in the combination of 200/65 ZR17 rear in SC0 compound and 125/70 ZR17 front in SC1 compound;
- DIABLO™ Rain tyres with an innovative rear tread pattern and available in two different compounds depending on the operating temperature;

 new DIABLO™ Supercorsa SC: a grooved tyre that is now in its third generation and has been completely redesigned in terms of structure, profiles, tread pattern and compounds based on a more consistent performance.

DIABLO™ Superbike SCX

The new SCX solution in 200/65 size for the DIABLO™
Superbike slick which uses an extremely soft compound and was custom designed to be used during qualifiers in preparation for using the single Superpole® tyre available to the riders, and possibly for the MOTUL FIM Superbike World Championship Tissot Superpole® Race. Throughout the year, various SCX solutions will be developed with the aim of finding the best one which, by the end of the championship season, will become part of the compounds range available to all motorcycle riders;

DIABLO™ Superbike in larger size

As in 2013 with the historic switch from 16.5-inch tyres to 17-inch tyres, Pirelli intends to continue being a pioneer in development, setting the guidelines for the future. For this reason, throughout 2018, the Italian tyre manufacturer developed and made available to the MOTUL FIM Superbike World Championship riders some larger 200/65 rear and 125/70 front solutions. These sizes proved to be able to offer, compared to the standard sizes, greater stability, more grip thanks to the wider contact surface, and an increase in consistency in terms of performance, trajectory precision and support.

After a year of development, Pirelli has now decided to add to the range, and therefore to make **available for purchase, the larger sizes in SC0 rear and SC1 front compound** with the goal of completing the compounds range during the FIM World Superbike in order to then make them available on the market in 2020.

DIABLO™ Rain

There is even news in the rain tyre department. Specifically, Pirelli has worked to improve performance of the rear tyre in the 200/60 ZR 17 size and in two different compounds.



PIRELLI TOP SPONSOR

The DIABLO™ RAIN tyre has a new design with different groove angles in the grip area which allow more even wear and greater tread stability, as well as on the shoulder grooves which improve water dispersion and consequently improve grip when leaning and traction coming out of turns. Two compounds are available:

- **SCR1:** compound intended for use cold conditions (asphalt temperatures lower than 15°C) or particularly smooth asphalt. Compared to another compound, it provides greater grip, obviously at the cost of long life.
- SCR2: compound dedicated to the hottest temperatures (asphalt temperatures higher than 15°C) or particularly aggressive asphalt. This will be the most used solution if the track is starting to dry out.

New DIABLO™ Supercorsa SC

The **DIABLO™** Supercorsa SC, a tyre launched in 2007, is now in its third generation and has been completely redesigned in terms of structure, profiles, tread pattern and compounds

based on a more consistent performance.

The Pirelli DIABLO™ Supercorsa SC tyres are grooved solutions intended for track use and dedicated to professional and amateur riders, as well as sport users seeking top spec performance on the track.

These tyres are also available in various compounds in order to take on the different types of asphalt and weather conditions that can be found on circuits all over the world but, unlike the DIABLO™ Superbike tyres, no SCX or SC3 compound is available.

The **DIABLO™** Supercorsa tyres are the ultimate in Pirelli's technological expression applied to the world of street-legal bikes. Their history and development are closely connected to those of the **MOTUL FIM Superbike World Championship** where they have been used in the WorldSSP600 and WorldSSP300 class since their launch in 2007.

2019 PIRELLI TYRE ALLOCATION



The tyres for WorldSBK class

All riders participating in the MOTUL FIM Superbike World Championship will have 17-inch Pirelli DIABLO™ Superbike tyres range as follows:

DIABLO™ Superbike, slick tyres with the following sizes:

- 120/70 front in SC1 (soft), SC2 (medium) and SC3 (hard) compounds.
- 125/70 front in **SC1 (soft)**
- 200/60 rear in SC0 (soft), SC1 (medium)
 compounds.

■ 200/65 rear in **SC0 (soft)**

DIABLO™ Superbike SCX, an extrasoft rear tyre designed to be used during qualifiers in preparation for using the single Superpole® tyre available to the riders, and possibly for the Tissot Superpole® Race. It is available in 4 pieces per rider for each round.

DIABLO™ Rain to be used in case of rain.

DIABLO™ Wet to be used when the track is neither completely dry nor completely wet.

DIABLO™ Superbike qualifier, a supersoft rear tyre for Superpole® on Saturday.

In addition, according to the FIM regulations:

• The maximum number of tyres, which each rider is allowed to use for the entire race weekend (Friday to Sunday), is 24, including 11 front and 13 rear tyres.



• The maximum permitted number of fitted tyres for each session will be 15 (no distinction between front and rear) for each rider.

Over the course of the year Pirelli plan to supply more development solutions.

Free Practices, Superpole® format and use of the qualifier rear tyres

The WorldSBK class schedule has:

- two Free Practices on Friday
- one Free Practice, one Superpole® session and Race
 1 on Saturday
- the Warm Up, the Tissot Superpole® Race and Race 2 on Sunday.

Regarding the Superpole® format and the use of qualifier rear tyres, all riders will each get one qualifier rear tyre. with a Pirelli label applied on the side. The qualifier rear tyres are marked with a sticker like all the tyres supplied.



The tyres for WorldSSP

All WorldSSP riders use treaded **DIABLO™ Supercorsa SC tyres** range as follows:

DIABLO™ Supercosa tyres with the following sizes:

- 120/70 front in SC1 (soft) and SC2 (medium) compounds.
- 180/60 rear in SC0 (soft), SC1 (medium)
 compounds.
- 190/60 rear in SC0 (soft), SC1 (medium) compounds.

DIABLO™ Rain to be used in case of rain.

DIABLO™ Wet to be used when the track is neither completely dry nor completely wet.

For this class there is not rear qualifier tyre.

According to the FIM Supersport World Championship regulations:

- The maximum number of tyres allowed in the entire race weekend (Friday to Sunday) is 18, including 8 front and 10 rear tyres.
- The maximum permitted number of fitted tyres for each session will be 11 (no distinction between front and rear) for each rider.

Over the course of the year Pirelli plan to supply more development solutions.

Free Practices and Superpole® format

The WorldSSP class schedule has:

- two Free Practices on Friday
- one Free Practice, one Superpole® session on Saturday
- the Warm Up and the Race on Sunday.

The Superpole® format is similar to the Superbike one, but in Supersport there are not qualifying rear tyres available for riders.



All FIM Supersport 300 World Championship riders use treaded DIABLO™ Supercorsa SC tyres 110/70 front in SC1 compound and 140/70 rear in SC1 compound (Honda 500 in 120/70 front and 160/60 rear).

With the WorldSSP300 entry list increasing for 2019, participants are separated into two groups of riders for both

Free Practice and Qualifying. At the end of Qualifying, the top 30 on the combined timesheets will make up Sunday's grid.

The WorldSSP300 class schedule has:

- two Free Practices on Friday
- one Free Practice, one Superpole® session and Last Chance Race on Saturday
- the Warm Up and the Race on Sunday.

TYRE LIMITATIONS FOR WorldSBK AND WorldSSP TYRES

The following limitations are applied to WorldSBK and WorldSSP teams and riders:

• Minimum tyre pressure:

Period

At all times 1.60 bar / 23,2 PSI

At the 5 minute board the pressure will be checked on the grid for a minimum of three riders using the Pirelli approved tyre gauge. At the same time the TPMS data from WorldSBK teams will be recorded for information only. If the tyre is below the minimum limit according to the Pirelli approved gauge then the machine will be removed from the grid to the pitlane to have the pressure corrected and the rider will start the warm up lap from the pitlane (and the race from the back of the grid).

Pressure

- The maximum pressure for seating the tyres on the rim is 4 bar. It's suggested to balance the rim before the tyre fitting (especially if the pressure sensor is used).
- During the race the TPMS data from WorldSBK teams will be logged by the Rev-Logger for post race analysis. The 2 way communication systems will be used to check the data (at lower rate) during the race. There will be no penalties applied as a result of this data.

A team or rider that uses more than the allocated number of engines during the championship will receive a penalty.

When a permanent rider changes teams during the championship both the team and riders engine limits will not change, but in extra-ordinary circumstances will be

reviewed by the Race Direction.

An engine is considered in use or active from the moment it crosses the finish line at the end of its first (out) lap, until that point it may be unsealed with no penalty, only one "out" lap is allowed, any further incomplete laps will register the engine as "active".

Electronics: The engine control system (including ECU) must be either:

A DWO/FIM approved "Superbike Kit System".

A DWO/FIM approved "Superstock 1000" kit model plus DWO/FIM approved data logger.

Fuel: The original tank may be modified to achieve the maximum capacity of 24 litres, provided the original profile is as homologated.

Tyres: Pirelli is the sole tyre supplier to the MOTUL FIM Superbike World Championship

The maximum number of tyres, of any type, available to each rider during the event will be 24 (11 front tyres—13 rear tyres).

Key Rules WorldSSP

The World Supersport class features mid-range machines. These bikes are smaller, lighter and less powerful than their World Superbike counterparts and fewer modifications are allowed. Current engines used are either 600cc with 4 cylinders or 675cc with 3 cylinders. The WorldSSP class produces some amazing on-track battles and is vitally important for manufacturers too. The minimum age is 16.

Tyres: Pirelli is the sole tyre supplier to the World Supersport Class. The maximum number of tyres, of any type, available to each rider during the event will be 18 (8 front tyres— 10 rear tyres).

Key Rules WorldSSP300

World Supersport 300 is a new feeder class which has been brought in for 2017. With a minimum rider age of 15, it will feature a range of lightweight sport bikes and is an easily accessible championship on the world stage. All bikes are homologated by motorcycle racing governing body the FIM. They are subject to modifications of weight and rev limits by the WorldSBK Commission, in order to ensure the maximum possible performance parity.

Tech Spec

Eligible Machines Machines sold in Europe as A2 class machines and excluding the A1 class machines.

Tyres: Pirelli is the sole tyre supplier to World Supersport 300.

The rider may use a maximum of three front and three rear dry weather tyres for each event.

One set of wet-weather tyres will be provided at each event.

Electronics: The WorldSSP300 control electronics system that will be compulsory for 2020 will also be allowed alongside the 2018 specification electronics in a transition season.

Qualifying

WorldSBK

Grid positions for Race One and the Tissot Superpole Race will be based on the fastest time recorded by the rider in the Tissot Superpole (SP) session. WorldSBK Superpole will run for 25 minutes.

Grid positions for Race Two will be determined as follow:

The first nine riders in the Tissot Superpole Race will take the first 9 grid positions according to the Tissot Superpole Race results.

As from row 4 (grid positions 10 and onwards), according to the qualifying time (for riders other than the ones classified 1 to 9 at the Tissot Superpole Race)

WorldSSP

Grid positions are determined by the fastest lap time recorded by each rider in the Tissot Superpole (SP) sessions. WorldSSP Superpole will run for 25 minutes.

WorldSSP300

The top 30 Grid positions will be based on the fastest time recorded by the riders in all qualifying practices



(combined times Group A and B) of free practices in case any qualifying have been cancelled.

In the event of a tie, riders' second and subsequent best times will be taken into account.

Riders not in the first 30 positions in the combined qualifying practices will have the chance to qualify for the race upon participation in the Last Chance Race. From row 11 to row 12 (grid position 31 to 36), will be based on results of Last Chance Race (Top 6 positions will be classified for the Race).

In the case here there is a change of condition of the track (The difference between the average of the best 3 riders fastest laps of Group A and Group B is greater than 1%) the position will be:

- The odd positions will be taken by the fastest group (Top 15)
- The even positions will be taken by the other group (Top 15)

Last Chance Race

All the riders not included in the first 30 grid positions will take part in the Last Chance Race.

The grid positions will be defined by the qualifying times according to the 1% rule.

The first six classified in the last chance race will take the grid positions for the WorldSSP300 race from 31 to 36.

The Last Chance race will not award points for the championship.

Any rider who fails to achieve a qualifying time will be permitted to take part in the race provided that in any of the free practise sessions and/or warm up he/she has achieved a time at least equal to 107% of the fastest rider in the same session. Such riders will start the race from the back of the grid, according to their free practise and/or warm up times.

Common Race Procedures

Wet and Dry Races

All races are categorised as wet or dry. A board may be displayed on the grid to indicate the status of the race. If no board is displayed, the race is automatically dry. The purpose of this classification is to indicate to riders the consequence of varying climatic conditions during a race.

World Supersport 300

- Dry Races A race classified as dry will be interrupted by the Race Director, if he considers that climatic conditions affecting the surface of the track makes it likely that riders will wish to change tyres.
- Wet Races A race classified as wet, usually commenced in varying or wet conditions, will not be interrupted for climatic reasons and riders who wish to change tyres or make adjustment must enter the pits and do so during the actual race.

In all cases where the first race is stopped for climatic reasons, then the restart will, automatically, be a "wet" race.

World Superbike and World Supersport races
A race will not be interrupted for climatic reasons
except for extraordinary events and riders who wish to
change tyres or make adjustments must enter the pits
and do so during the actual race.

Interruption of a race (all classes)

If the Race Director decides to interrupt a race at any point from the start of the warm up lap onwards, then red flags will be displayed at the finish line and at all marshals' posts and he will switch on the red lights around the circuit. Riders must immediately slow down and return to the pits.

The results will be established taking into account main and secondary time keeping points. The order of classification shall be based upon the total number of completed laps and the order of last crossing point for each individual rider prior the showing of the red flag.

To be classified a rider must:

- Complete 75% of the laps of the leader of the race rounded down to the nearest whole number of laps;
- Enter the pit lane using the designated track within 5 minutes after the red flag has been displayed, pushing or riding on their motorcycle.

Less than three laps:

If the results calculated show that less than three laps have been completed by the leader of the race, then the race will be null and void and a new race will be run according to the article 1.27.4. If it is found impossible to re-start the race, then it will be declared cancelled and the race will not count for the Championship.



For Superbike Superpole race: If the results calculated show that fewer than three laps have been completed by the leader of the race, then the race will be null and void and a new race will be run according to the article 1.27.4.d.

3 laps to two-thirds distance:

If three laps or more have been completed by the leader of the race, but less than two-thirds of the original race distance, rounded down to the nearest whole number of laps, then the race will be re-started according to article 1.27.4. If it is found impossible to re-start the race, then the results will count and half points will be awarded in the Championship.

For Superbike Superpole race: If five laps or more have been completed by the leader of the race, the race is considered valid.

Two-thirds distance or more:

If the results calculated show that two-thirds of the current race distance rounded down to the nearest whole number of laps have been completed by the leader of the race, then the race will be deemed to have been completed and full Championship points will be awarded.

Ride through procedure

A 'Ride-Through' penalty can be imposed on a rider by Race Direction if, for example, he has jump-started and left his starting position before the red lights go off to signal the race has commenced, or if a rider arrives at pit lane entry after safety car, and they don't start the race from pit lane.

During the race, the rider will be requested to ride through the pit lane, stopping is not permitted, and he may then rejoin the race. The rider must respect the speed limit in the pit lane, and in case of infraction of this speed limit, the ride through procedure will be repeated; if it happens for the second time, the black flag will be shown to the rider.

In the case of a race interrupted prior to the penalty being complied with, and if there is a second part, the rider will be required to ride through after the start of the second part of the race. In the case of a rider carrying forward a penalty for anticipation of the start, into the second part of an interrupted race and subsequently found to have anticipated the second start, the rider will be shown the black flag.

A yellow board displaying the rider's number will be shown at the finish line and the information will also be displayed on the time keeping monitors. Failure by the relevant rider to ride through, having been shown the board 5 times, will result in that rider being shown the black flag.

In the case where the organisation has been unable to carry out the ride through penalty before the end of the race, the relevant rider will be inflicted with an automatic time penalty.

If the infraction is committed during the last five laps, and the rider will not be able to enter the pit lane an automatic time penalty will be applied. This cannot be subject of any protest or appeal. This automatic penalty will be calculated thus: The time to pass through the pit lane from pit entry to pit exit at 60 km/h + 20% rounded down to the nearest second.

Quick Restart Procedure

When a race is stopped, riders must return to the pit lane, unless otherwise instructed by officials. If there is to be a second part to the race, minor repairs may be carried out.

Upon arrival in the pit lane, riders may make adjustments to their machine. Refuelling is permitted in the pit lane for teams with no garages. When all riders have entered the pit lane the Race Director will announce the time remaining to the re-opening of the pit lane. The duration between the red flag and the

actual opening of the pit exit will be 10 minutes or more. The time remaining to the opening of the pit exit will be displayed on timing screens and the 5, 4, 3, 2 and 1 minute(s) count-down boards are shown at the pit exit.

When the time period has elapsed, the pit lane exit will be opened for SIXTY SECONDS only. Riders will make one lap at unrestricted speed to the starting grid, followed by a Safety Car. Any rider delaying the progress of the sighting lap will be overtaken by the Safety Car. Any rider arriving behind the Safety Car must go into the pit lane. Any riders remaining in the pit lane after it has been closed will have to start the warm up lap from the pit exit and start the race from the back of the grid.

After the closure of the pit lane exit, tyre warmers must be removed from all machines remaining in the pit lane. ONE mechanic only, per rider, may go onto the grid (without tools) to primarily indicate to his rider his position on the grid. When the rider takes his grid position, the mechanic must immediately leave the grid.

All riders will arrive back on the starting grid, and stop, with engines running, no adjustments may be made. As soon as the Safety Car arrives on the back of the grid, a 30 seconds board will be shown. These 30 seconds may be reduced at the discretion of the Race Direction when the grid is cleared and it is considered safe.

After 30 seconds have elapsed a green flag will be shown to start the warm up lap, and the warm up lap will be completed at unrestricted speed, followed by a Safety Car. When the last rider has passed the pit exit it will be opened for a period of 30 seconds to release any rider waiting. The pit lane exit will remain closed until after the start of the race. Any rider delaying the progress of the warm up lap will be overtaken by the Safety Car.

Any rider not able to leave the pit exit has a final option of starting the race from the pit exit.

Rules then follow the same as a normal race start, and riders will start from their given position.

Flags and Lights

Marshals and other officials display flags or lights to provide information and/or convey instructions to the riders. All flags are presented waved.

Green Flag

The track is clear. This flag must be waved at each flag marshal post for the first lap of each practice session and of the warm up, for the sighting lap and for the warm up lap. This flag must be shown waved at the flag marshal post immediately after the incident that necessitated the use of one or more yellow flags. This flag must be waved by the starter to signal the start of the warm up lap. This flag may be waved at pit exit, in conjunction with the official signal of the green light, as an extra signal that pit lane exit is open.

Yellow and Red Striped Flag

The adhesion on this section of the track could be affected by any reason other than rain. This flag must be shown waved at the flag marshal post.

White Flag with diagonal red cross

Drops of rain on this section of the track. This flag must be waved at the flag marshal post.

White Flag with diagonal red cross + Yellow and Red Striped Flag

Rain on this section of the track. These flags must be waved together at the flag marshal post.

White Flag Waved at all the flag marshal posts

This flag indicates that it is raining at some parts of the circuit. Only the Race Direction can take the decision.

Blue Flag Waved at the flag marshal post

This flag indicates to a rider that he is about to be overtaken. During the practice sessions, the rider concerned must keep his line and slow down gradually

to allow the faster rider to pass him. During the race, the rider concerned is about to be lapped. He must allow the rider(s) who are lapping him to pass him at the earliest opportunity. Passing within a group of lapped riders is forbidden under the blue flag. Waved at a marshal post after the pit lane exit, this flag indicates to a rider exiting pit lane that riders are approaching on track. The rider exiting pit lane must do so safely and without disturbing riders on track.

Chequered Black/White Flag

This (these) flag(s) will be waved at the finish line on track level to indicate the finish of race or practice session.

Chequered Black/White Flag and Blue Flag

The chequered black/white flag(s) will be waved together with the blue flag at the finish line on track level when a rider(s) closely precedes the leader during the final lap before the finish line.

Green Light

This light must be switched on at the pit lane exit to signal the start of each practice session and of the warm up, the start of the sighting lap(s) and the start of the warm up lap.

Flashing Blue Lights

Will be switched on at the pit lane exit at all time during practices and races.

Flags Which Convey Information and Instructions:

Yellow Flag Waved at each row of the starting grid

This flag indicates that the start of the race is delayed. Waved at one row (or more) of the starting grid, this flag indicates that a rider on that row is having difficulties. A single yellow flag waved at the flag marshal post indicates that there is a danger ahead beside the track. Two yellow flags waved together at the flag marshal

post indicate that there is a hazard wholly or partly blocking the track. The riders must slow down and be prepared to stop. Overtaking is forbidden up until the point where the green flag is waved.

Any Infringement of this rule during a practice session will result in the cancellation of the time of the lap during which the infraction occurred. In case of infringement of this rule during the race, the rider must go back the number of positions decided by the Race Direction. During the final inspection lap, this flag must be waved at the exact place where the flag marshal will be positioned during the practices, the warm ups and races.

Red Flag and Red Lights

When the race or practice is being interrupted, the red flag will be waved at each flag marshal post and the red lights around the track will be switched on. Riders must return slowly to the pits. When the pit-lane exit is closed, the light will be switched on and the red flag may be used in conjunction with the official red light signal. Riders are not allowed to exit the pit lane. The red flag will be shown motionless on the starting grid at the end of the warm up lap. The red flag may also be used to close the track. The red lights will be switched on at the start line for between 2 and 5 seconds to start each race.

Black Flag

This flag is used to convey instructions to one rider only and is waved at each flag marshal post together with the rider's number. The rider must stop at the pits at the end of the current lap. He cannot restart when this flag results from a penalty. Any Infringement of this rule may be penalised by the Race Direction. This flag can also be presented to a rider for a reason other than a penalty (ie. for checking or changing a transponder), in that case he can restart.

Black Flag with orange disk

This flag is used to convey instructions to one rider only and is waved at each flag marshal post together with the rider's number. This flag informs the rider that his motorcycle has mechanical problems likely to endanger himself or others, and that he must immediately leave the track.
